#### COLLEGE STREET & EDGWARE ROAD

- **Gateway Beacons**  
Peter Freeman  
Situating at two junctions with Regent Street, these motion-activated light sculptures – best seen at night – were installed in 2011.

#### HAVELOCK SQUARE

- **Isambard Kingdom Brunel**  
(1806-1859), Chief Engineer of the Great Western Railway, founded the GWR Works in 1841, bringing the railway to the town. The statue has been a meeting point since 1973.

#### MILTON ROAD / OLD CANAL PATH

- **Untitled**  
unknown  
Just off Milton Road, on the old canal path, is this 'mediterranean-themed' street art. It's been there since at least 2014.

#### NEWBRIDGE SQUARE

Unveiled in 1991, this minimalist steel sculpture was purchased by Allied Dunbar, then one of the Town Centre's major employers.

#### RAILWAY STATION

- **Jubilee Clock**

Edwin Wright and Cumbria Clock Co. Commissioned to celebrate the Golden Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth II, Jubilee Clock was originally installed at the Regent Street/ Canal Walk crossroads but was moved to its current site in 2012.

#### REGENT CIRCUS

- **Swindon Town Hall**  
Brightwen Binyon, architect  
Opened on 21st October 1891. The clock tower was designed to be the highest building in New Swindon, and higher than Old Town's Christ Church. Old and New Swindon united in 1900 – the Town Hall has been a focus of local events ever since.

- **Swindon Cenotaph**  
John Daymond & Son, architectural sculptors, London  
Unveiled on 30<sup>th</sup> October 1920 to honour the memory of soldiers who died during WWI.

- **Pavement Light Projection**
- **Our Mural**

Martin Travers, Lionel Stanhope  
Celebrating the triumph of local conservation, depicting the Marsh Fritillary butterfly, purple Devil's Bit Scabious flowers, the Yellow Wagtail and a grey Heron, often seen near bodies of water in Swindon.

- **Salubris et Industria**  
Tim Carroll  
Named for Swindon's motto – 'health and industry' – the mural is a re-imagining of a recently discovered painting by Harold Dearden, Head of Swindon School of Art from 1920-1950.

- **Rainbow Bench**

#### REGENT PLACE

- **My Town, Our World**  
Martin Travers, Peter Crowdy  
INSWINDON BID CO. LTD  
Painted in 2019 on the steps leading up to the Wyvern Theatre this large-scale mural contrasts silhouettes of urban Swindon with symbols of our rural surroundings including Wiltshire's county bird, the Great Bustard.

#### REGENT STREET/ REGENT PLACE ALLEYWAY

- **Hope**  
Hannah Parry, Casey Hillier, Sally Taylor, Sue Bardwell (lead artists)  
Designed and painted by young people to process and heal from the experiences of the Covid-19 pandemic and to share hope and positivity with the wider community.

#### REGENT STREET

- **W W Hunter building**  
Built in 1901 as William Hunters' furniture shop – he traded here until the 1940s.

#### REGENT STREET / CANAL WALK CROSSROADS

- **Golden Lion**  
Carlton Attewood  
Sculpted to celebrate Queen Elizabeth's golden jubilee in 1977, the Golden Lion replicates the original weatherworn lion which adorned the roof of The Golden Lion public house, close to this site.

- **Stacked Fountain**  
Richard Stump, John Hall (Walter Jack Studio)  
Made with 1,000 pieces of laser cut steel and installed in 2010.
